If you have been informed by a college that it has not been received, see your counselor or Mrs. Ferguson in the Career Center as soon as possible, and we can re-send it. In May, seniors will meet with their counselors to fill out the senior survey. At that time, you will tell your counselor where you are attending college, and we will send your final transcript there in late June.
