Reminder: Health Information and Emergency Care Forms

The Health Information Form (HIF) (SS/SE -71) and the Emergency Care Information form (SS/SE-3) provide valuable information regarding student health conditions. These forms are critical in the early identification of students who may need healthcare support in the educational environment. Along with the development of Healthcare Plans (HCP) and Action Plans, the Public

Health Nurses (PHN) utilize the information contained in the HIF to develop teaching strategies for FCPS staff. As the school year begins virtually, it is important that all parents/guardians complete both these forms, which are required for all students. These forms are available for electronic submission by parents via their [FCPS 24/7](#) (Blackboard) accounts within the weCare@school (weCare) module.

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
